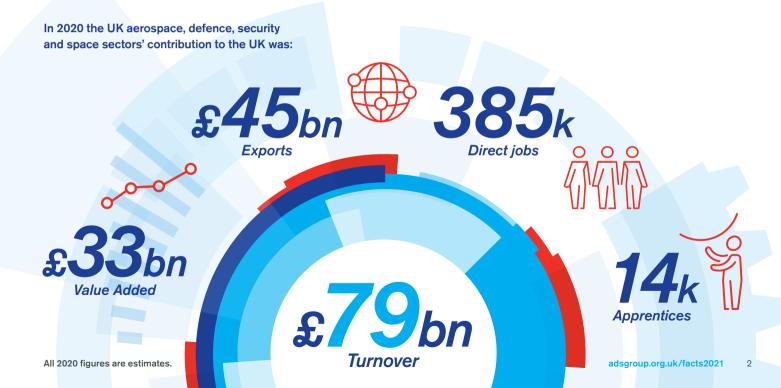

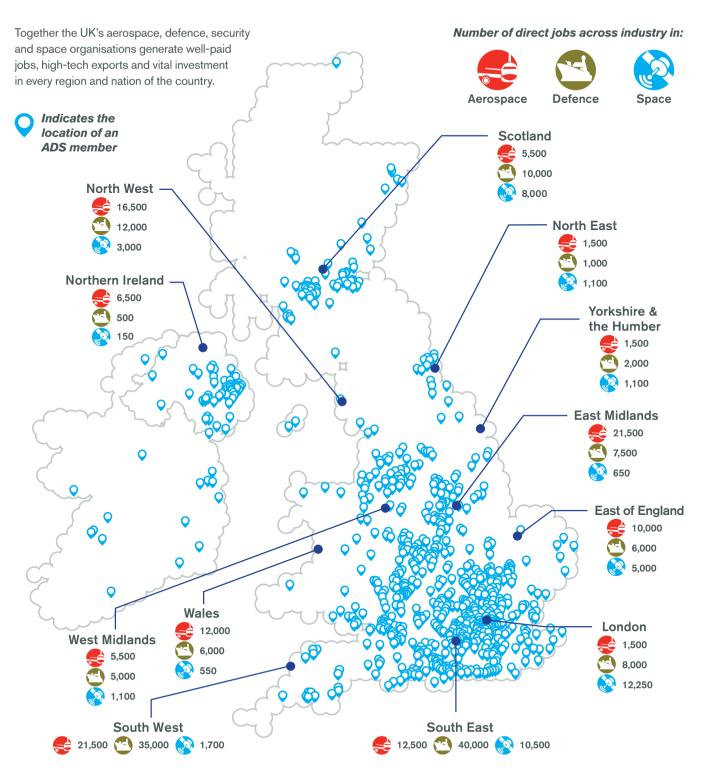

Impact of COVID-19 on UK sectors

This annual publication is used by ADS, our members, partners and stakeholders as a reference for the size and strength of our sectors at the end of the previous calendar year.

The facts and figures in this annual guide to our sectors therefore reflect their size and strength as recorded in Q1 2021 for the full year 2020. This is the latest data and set of estimates available to us at the time of publication.

At the time of publishing in May 2021, the world economy, UK economy and our sectors have been heavily impacted over the previous 15 months by COVID-19.

The impact of the pandemic is ongoing, particularly on manufacturing and travel sectors. The last 12 months has seen the announcement of significant job losses and business restructuring.

ADS publishes regular monthly insights into the economic performance of civil aerospace, and engaged with members through a variety of formats on the current economic conditions they are facing. As with all data sets, the figures used here are subject to revision over time.

Aerospace Growth Partnership (AGP)

More than 10 years of industry and government working in partnership to make the UK the most attractive aerospace location in the world.

Nearly 350 companies across the UK have benefitted from more than £2.8bn in R&D investment through the Aerospace
Technology Institute.

£15m of funding for the FlyZero Programme looking at the design challenges and market opportunity of potential zero-emission aircraft concepts. Encourages bottom up innovation through the National Aerospace Technology Exploitation Programme (NATEP), which will deliver £10m to mature 60 aerospace technologies and create jobs in the supply chain.

Delivering new technologies and UK growth

- Average annual earnings of £43,000, 38% higher than the UK average
- 88% of aerospace jobs are located outside of London and the South East
- 97% of aerospace output is for export

Defence Growth Partnership (DGP)

DGP will continue to strategically support the UK defence sector through a joint government and industry approach to developing international Team UK collaboration and partnership opportunities to support export led growth. In partnership with MoD and Industry the Joint Economic Data Hub (JEDHub) will reach Full Operating Capability in 2021, providing stronger data and analysis on the economic contribution of the Defence sector to the UK economy.

Security and Resilience Growth Partnership (SRGP)

Delivering security at home, abroad and online

- Average annual earnings of £38,000, 21% higher than the UK average
- The cyber security sector added more than £4bn in value to the economy in 2020, attracting £800m of investment
- In 2019, the UK was third largest exporter of global security exports
- The global security market is expected to reach an annual value of \$167bn by 2025





The UK space sector is a world leader in the production of small satellites with wide applications to help monitor the world around us. Space launch from the UK is fast becoming a reality with plans on track for a first rocket launch in 2022.



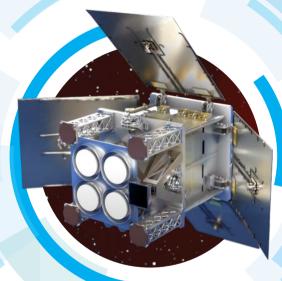

Space sector priorities and opportunities

The UK's space sector is at the forefront of exploring the universe, connecting people, keeping citizens safe and enabling critical infrastructure.

Steps to achieving commercial space flight launch from the UK are now being taken, with proposed horizontal and vertical launch sites from Scotland to Cornwall.

Industry stands ready to work with the UK's National Space Council, which will inform strategic space priorities across government. Our space sector is a global innovation leader, committed to support delivery of the UK's net zero ambitions by developing sustainable fuels and the next generation of satellites.

Delivering innovation and the technologies of tomorrow

- UK space accounts for 5.1% of the global space economy
- 40% of all small satellites currently in orbit were manufactured in the UK
- All of the UK's regions and nations are home to headquarters of space organisations
